From the Ground Up

This summer, while I was in South Carolina for my studies, the choir and I chose "The Universal Christ" by Richard Rohr for our annual summer book study. While we only got through part one of the book, it was deeply meaningful to me, and I'd like to share my big takeaway with y'all: Everything is a gift. I'm sure we've all heard this at some point in our lives, but the Richard Rohr approach helped me see how to view everything as a gift.

In my life, the small blessings that surround me every day often get overshadowed by the busy-ness I create for myself. It's easy to become consumed by all sorts of things - achievements, material possessions, or even staying organized and doing good work. But, truly, spiritual growth and a deeper connection with God can be found in the most unexpected places—in the humblest and simplest moments around us. Richard Rohr writes about **The Great Chain of Being**, using some of the teachings of St. Bonaventure, a Bishop, Cardinal, and scholar in the 1200s who taught that to work up to loving God, start by loving the very humblest and simplest things, and then move up from there:

"Let us place our first step in the ascent at the bottom, presenting to ourselves the whole material world as a mirror, through which we may pass over to God, who is the supreme craftsman. The Creator's supreme power, wisdom, and benevolence shine forth through all created things."

Reading this made me reflect on the last time I stepped away from a textbook, my phone, or my never-ending to-do list to appreciate something small: the sound of frogs in the backyard of the room I was renting when I came home each night, the noises of my host family cooking dinner in the other room, or one of the many neighborhood cats pausing to meow a hello. Honestly, it had been a while since I'd paused to appreciate anything other than a completed assignment or a good grade. This book encouraged me to try cultivating gratitude for these modest gifts to open my heart

to a deeper appreciation of God's presence in my life and see each moment as an opportunity to connect with the Divine.

Richard Rohr writes that Jesus is the gift that honored the gift. "From the first moments of the Big Bang, nature was revealing the glory and goodness of the Divine Presence; it must be seen as a gratuitous gift and not a necessity. Jesus came to live in its midst and enjoy life in all its natural variations, and thus became our model and exemplar." Rohr challenges the reader to start at the bottom, literally, and to love rocks and elements first, then trees, then animals, then humans, encouraging us that "angels will soon seem like a real possibility, and God is then just a short leap away." I didn't like this at first. Growing our love of God from the literal ground up instead of starting at the top with the one who loved us first. It felt wrong. But then I read what followed, "how you do anything, is how you do everything." This really spoke to me and drew me to the importance of allowing our love for God to extend to all of the things he has created.

The Apostle Peter reminds us of the magnificent gifts we have already received in 2 Peter 1:3-4:"His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature, having escaped the corruption in the world caused by evil desires." God has already provided us with everything we need for a godly life.

By recognizing and appreciating the simple gifts around us, we tap into this divine power and begin to understand the depth of God's love and provision. In the simplest things, we find the greatest gifts. And in those gifts, we find the path to loving God more deeply and living the godly life He has called us to embrace. I hope my sharing this with you blessed you as it did me!






