# What Happened in Guatemala?

My overarching question for our trip to Guatemala this summer was: "Is this mission a good fit for Holy Cross' long list of ministry opportunities?" Obviously, time will tell us the answer to that; but let me share with you a little about our time there this July.

Thankfully, safety was never a major concern. We were, of course, very careful. We kept a close eye on one another and maintained good boundaries. However, compared to other countries I have visited that are typically considered unsafe – such as Bulgaria in the 90s, Northeastern Brazil, San Pedro Sula in Honduras, and Piedras Negras on the Mexican border – Guatemala felt much friendlier and safer. The people we met were fantastic, always friendly, and eager to help us in any way they could.

While there, we built (to completion) two houses for two families - taking their beds out of the mud floors of shacks with no doors or windows and welcoming them into nice, dry homes with two windows and

a metal door that locks. There simply are no words. It leaves me speechless to think about.

The food was also good, and the sleeping arrangements were ample – much like a rustic church camp only with better mattresses.

Also, while we were there, we hosted around 50 children for Vacations Bible Study. The families who attended joined in joyfully with dance and song and answering Bible questions. The message: your hands are the hands of God and were created to do meaningful and good things. VBS seemed to us to be a thrill, but little did I realize at the time that the resident leader - Margarita - hosts these families and more (around 75-100 children) every week of the year. She also organizes and distributes food for over twenty families, each of whom are sponsored through people here in the US.

To me, of all of the meaningful and life impacting moments of this trip, one of the most important came during a wedding that Fr. Matt had agreed to officiate over while we were there. Honestly, between the language and culture barrier, and with a torrential rain storm pounding on the tin roof as we tried to listen to Matt speak, the wedding was a bit...umm...confusing.

However, after Matt pronounced the final blessing of God on the marriage, the couple did something strange. They refused to leave the altar. Instead, they turned and faced Matt. Then someone got Vicki (Matt's wife) and pushed her to the front by his side. Then they began to speak - it was the couple's turn to pronounce God's blessing! They thanked and blessed Matt and Vicki with all of their hearts, not just for sponsoring their family for the last decade, but also for all of the good that this mission has done and is doing in their community.

Maybe the profundity of this memory doesn't communicate to you here. Maybe you had to be there. But when that couple turned to bless them, then the entire wedding made sense and the

difference this missionary work makes was undeniably clear. They were there because of the love God had sown in their lives through this Guatemala mission.

Oh, the boy, Keven, in this picture with the kitten. He was one of the three children who now will live in the house I spent most of my time working on. He sort of took to me while I was there, and, truth be told, I took to him too. People kept pointing out how he watched me all the time. Keven is a sweet kid; and, he needs a sponsor. I am unsure if this will be a long-term good fit for our ministries, but, if it is up to the four of us from Holy Cross that went this summer, it sure would be a good fit for us to go back again next year! And some of you may hit choose to join us.
